### *Should* for recommendations

Where **should** I go?

They **shouldn't** miss Insadong.

( = They should see Insadong.)

**Should** she go to Cairo?

Yes, she **should**.

No, she **shouldn't**.

### *Can for possibility*

What **can** I do there?

You **can** enjoy cafés, shops, and fountains.

You **can't** see all of the museum in one day.

**Can** they take a taxi?

Yes, they **can**.

No, they **can't**.

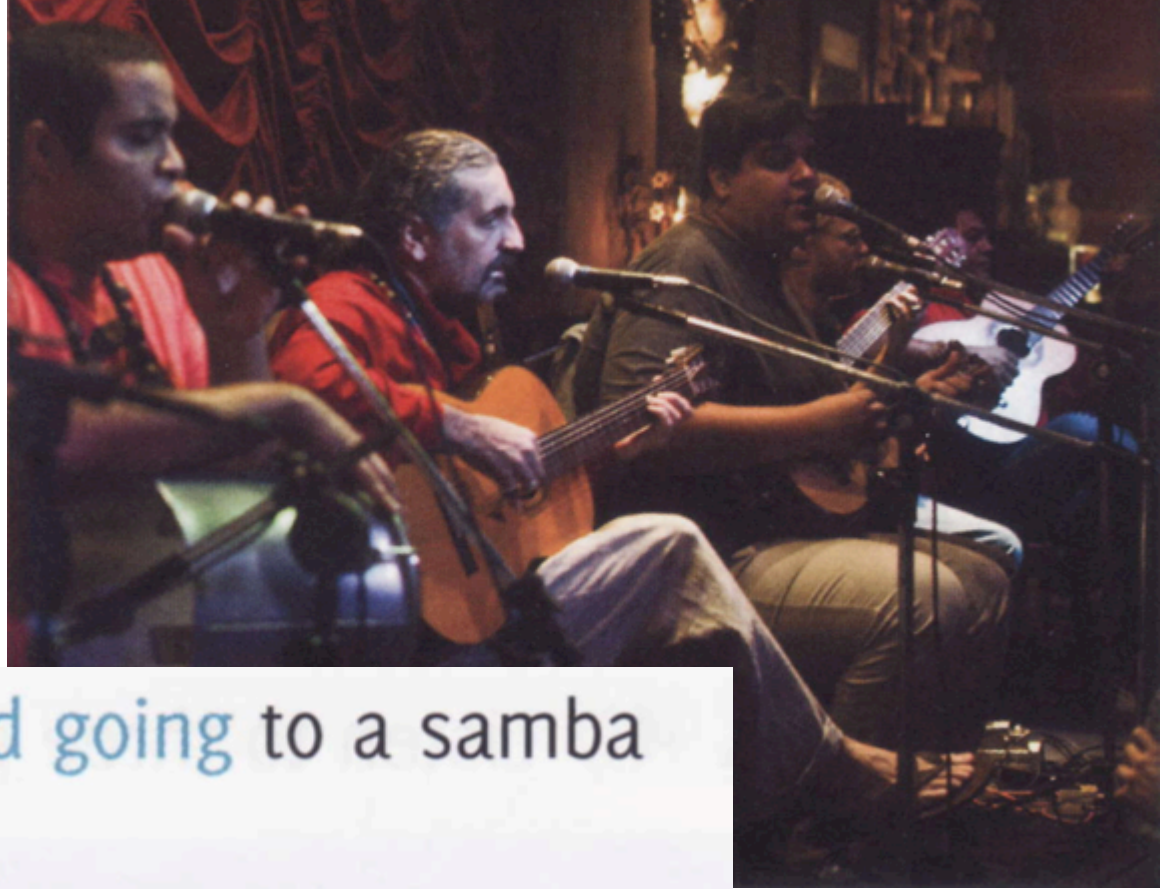


**Lucy:** Hi, Alex.

**Alex:** I'd recommend going to a samba club.

## Superlative adjectives

Sydney is **the biggest** city in Australia.

Sydney is one of **the most exciting** cities in the world.

Sydney has **the best** restaurants in the country.

What's **the cleanest** city in your country?

What city has **the most traditional** restaurants?

Is it **the worst** restaurant?

Yes, it is.

No, it isn't.

### Adjective

clean

safe

big

ugly

stressful

good

bad

### Superlative

**the cleanest**

**the safest**

**the biggest**

**the ugliest**

**the most** stressful

**the best**

**the worst**



## One-syllable Adjectives

**1. Form the superlative forms of a one-syllable adjective by adding –est.**

**Examples:**

long – longest / tall – tallest

**2. If the one-syllable adjective ends with an e, just add –st for the comparative form.**

**Examples:**

cute – cutest / large – largest

**3. Add –est to adjectives that end in consonant-vowel-consonant and double the last consonant.**

**Examples:**

big – biggest / hot – hottest

## Two-syllable Adjectives

1. With most two-syllable adjectives, you form the superlative with most.

**Examples:**

honest – most honest / famous – most famous

2. If the two-syllable adjectives ends with –y, change the y to i and add –est for the comparative form.

**Examples:**

happy – happiest / crazy – craziest

3. Two-syllable adjectives ending in –er, –le, or –ow take –er to form the superlative forms.

**Examples:**

narrow – narrowest / gentle – gentlest

## Adjectives with Three or More Syllables

Add more to adjectives that has 3 or more syllables.

### Examples:

expensive – most expensive

/

difficult – most difficult

### Irregular Adjectives

good – best

bad – worst

far – furthest / fartherst

little – least

much – most
