Modal verbs: present and past possibility Multi-words verbs:Object pronouns




Past continuous vs Past simple

1. Actions in progress at a certain time in the past / certain point in the story.	1. Past complete actions.
	We ate out yesterday / We went to the zoo last week.
After dinner I went into the living room and saw that she was crying .	2. Past habits of states.
When she opened the door, we were talking about her.	We often went to the cinema after work / He really loved sport, and was very fit.
2. Narrative use: used to set the scene at the beginning of the story.	3. Situations that started and finished in the past (duration).
It was getting dark, and I was working to the pub when	l played football for 20 years. How long did you live in Brussels?
	4. Narrative use: events of the story in chronological order.
	She opened the door, looked at us and went to her room.



Past Simple Pronunciation








Direct Speech

Repeats or "quotes", the exact words spoken.

Written : There is no change in this words.





Examples

She said, <u>"W</u>hat time will you be home" <u>"They think it's a more respectable job"</u>, said Jo. <u>"I</u> don't agree", I replied. John said, <u>"T</u>here's an elephant outside" <u>"There's a fly in my soup!"</u>, screamed Simone. Daniel asked, <u>"W</u>hat was the homework<u>?"</u>.



Uses of WHEN

Interruption

He was holding his newborn baby when you called.

Same time

He was holding his newborn baby when he was talking on the phone.

Immediately after

When you call, he picked up his phone.

Anytime / whenever

When he has a question, he calls the doctor.

Use it before the past simple to describe an event that interrupts another event.



Uses of WHILE

Same time

He was holding his newborn baby While (when) he was talking on the phone.

Contrast

While some fathers were uncomfortable holding newborns, he was not awkward at all.

Use it before the past continuous to describe a background event to another event.
